Pastor's Corner

We are now in the Season after Epiphany. The Season of Epiphany is "bookended" by two Sundays: the Baptism of the Lord (January 8) and Transfiguration (March 2).

Front and center is the baptism of Jesus as told in Matthew's gospel. Matthew's account is in two parts: John's objection and the baptism itself. Each is important. Matthew is the only gospel writer to record reticence by John to baptize Jesus. Matthew's is also the only gospel that includes Jesus' reply to John's objection. "Let that go, now. This is the way it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness."

Let what go? John's objection was that Jesus ought to be baptizing him rather than the other way around. Jesus was the One, after all, and John but a messenger, a forerunner. Jesus insists not only that John should baptize him, but that <u>he should let go of his objec-</u> tion, his vision of how things "should be," and that such letting go was how **both** of them could "fulfill all righteousness." In God's kingdom, the least are blessed above all. The least or lesser thereby become the primary channel to bless all others.

How about you? How are you living out of your baptism? Are you a channel of blessing to others? I invite you to spend a few minutes with the Lord remembering your baptism and reflecting on what God might be calling you to do to "live out of" your baptism this week and into the future of this year. Each year when we renew our baptismal vows, we reaffirm our covenant to

"faithfully participate in the ministries of the church through

our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness." Being a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ is not easy. Belonging to a faith community with other disciples gives us both an opportunity to study and grow in the faith, in service, and in witness.

Each morning of his life, Martin Luther would awaken and then wash his face. As the water splashed down his cheeks, he would say aloud,

"Martin, you are baptized, you are Mine and you are loved." Try it this month and see if starting your day reminds you that you are claimed, named, and called as God's own child... and that you will continue the day living and loving as one of His.
