## **Pastor's Corner**

February is a month focused on heart health, and showing family and friends we care on Valentine's day. As Christians, we know that we are called to check our heart's spiritual health and to show love and care to others every day.

When it comes to our spiritual heart, Jesus tells us that our hearts should be sincere as we worship with praise and thanksgiving to our God. It is not to be a service of rituals that we follow because that is what we are supposed to do. Every action and deed we do should be motived by love. A healthy spiritual heart has pure and honest motivations in all we do; this includes loving those with whom we disagree and do not like; people who have hurt us, who are unforgiving.

People who are not like us, who have hurt us, taken advantage of us, deceived us are the very people who test our spiritual heart health. Lent will begin in March, which is a time of introspection, discovering what God wants us to prune from our lives or add to our lives. I would encourage you to begin that process now, before we reach Ash Wednesday on March 6<sup>th</sup>. Let each of us take time to check what we bring to our God when we whenever we worship, not if the worship service meets our

expectations, but rather, do we meet God's expectations as we worship him? When we see someone who was our friend or a family member whom we cannot stand to be near, check our hearts. Dig deeply to find the love of Christ within us and reach out to that person with Christ's love.

Check your heart often to identify where it is directing you; toward God or slowly moving away from God. It is also important to keep our physical heart healthy, which is important to God, so we may continue to minister to others.
